

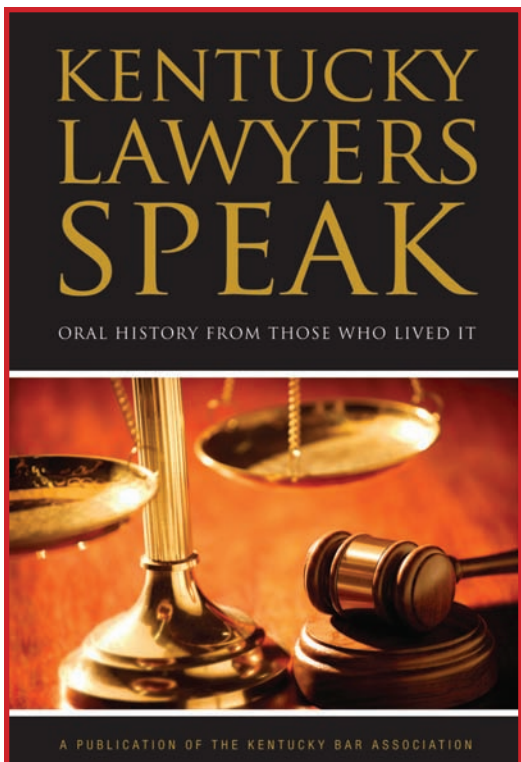
# This holiday season, share the stories of 74 lawyers whose careers in communities large and small left indelible marks on the legal profession in the Commonwealth.
